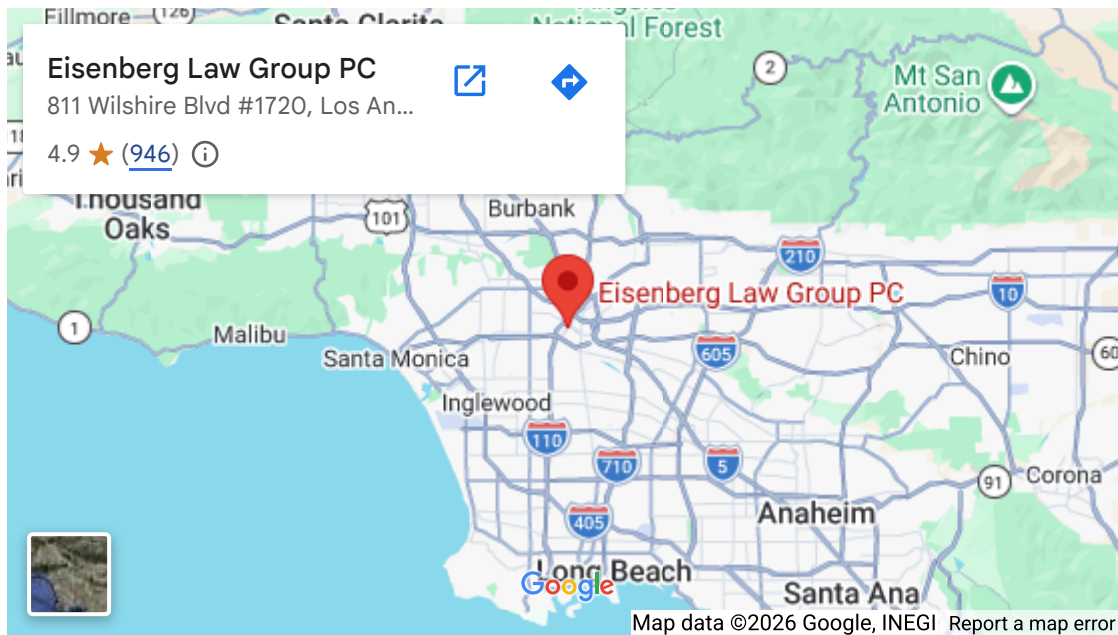

What Is Traumatic Amputation and How Is It Different from Surgical Amputation?
