Choosing the Right Box Sizes

Large boxes are better reserved for lightweight but bulky items such as bedding and pillows, since filling a large box with heavy items risks the box breaking during transport.

Wardrobe boxes allow clothing to be transported on hangers, saving significant packing and unpacking time. Mirror and picture boxes provide flat, rigid protection for framed artwork and mirrors, reducing the risk of cracked glass or bent frames during the move.

Permanent markers and colored labels make it easier to identify which room each box belongs in once you arrive at the new home. Numbering boxes and keeping a corresponding list of contents adds an extra layer of organization, particularly useful for households with a large number of boxes to track.

Estimating How Many Supplies You Need

A general guideline suggests planning for roughly ten to fifteen boxes per room for an average household, though this varies based on how much you own and how much you plan to declutter before the move. Ordering slightly more than the estimated amount is usually better than running short partway through packing.
