This is the window for pre-emergent herbicides to stop crab grass. Go for when dirt temperature levels hit approximately 55 degrees for numerous days. That typically lands anywhere from late March to mid April, depending on the year. If you intend to seed bare spots in spring, avoid pre-emergent in that location or use a product classified for brand-new seed.

On soils that evaluated acidic, late winter or very early springtime is a smart time for lime. Numerous Philadelphia yards rest between pH 5.5 and 6.3. Cool-season lawns choose 6.2 to 7.0.
