Consider battery life, local override options, and whether the lock retains manual keyed entry in the event of electronic failure. Regular inspections can reveal loose screws, weather-related swelling, and other small issues that escalate into lockouts if ignored. New homeowners typically rekey within weeks of purchase to ensure no previous keys remain effective. A documented key control procedure and occasional rekey cycles reduce insider risk and make access audits meaningful.

Finding value without accepting unsafe shortcuts

Value combines fair pricing with transparent procedures, proper credentials, and a reasonable materials warranty. Ask whether the parts offered are OEM, aftermarket, or refurbished so you understand long-term reliability differences. A

How to file a complaint or follow up on poor workmanship

If the final work is unsatisfactory, first contact the company with specific complaint points and request corrective action or a refund.
