Ask for a certificate of insurance and confirm protection levels. Numerous home supervisors need a minimum of a million in liability. Also check that the company is allowed to operate in your city or county and is registered with the local garbage dump or transfer station. If they carry devices with refrigerants, they must follow EPA rules for refrigerant healing.
