The improper reduce, the incorrect season, or a boring saw can induce a cascade of troubles: water sprouts, decay pockets, fungal infections, and, in the worst case, structural failure.

Beyond biology, there's chance. Branches that appearance serene on a still day can behave unpredictably if you happen to step under them with a noticed. Weight distribution, interior decay, and wind-loading aren't evident from the flooring. 1. Overextended branches and imbalanced crowns

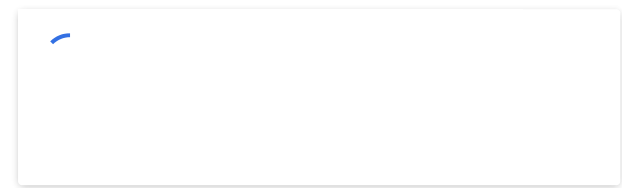
