

Is Breeze Airlines Safe to Fly? Safety, Reliability & Reviews

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If you are considering a flight with Breeze Airways, one of the first questions you may ask is, **is breeze airlines safe?** Breeze is a relatively young U.S. airline that began passenger operations in 2021. Like other scheduled U.S. carriers, it operates under Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) regulations and is subject to federal aviation safety requirements.

While Breeze has a shorter operating history than major airlines such as Delta or American, available safety information provides several useful points for travelers to consider.

Is Breeze Airlines Safe?

So, is breeze airlines safe for everyday travelers? Overall, current public safety information does not indicate that Breeze has an unusual safety concern compared with other U.S. scheduled carriers.

Breeze operates commercial passenger flights under the FAA's regulatory framework. The FAA maintains records covering certified air carriers, accident and incident information, and other aviation-safety data.

AirlineRatings currently gives Breeze Airways a 5/7 safety rating and lists the airline among its recognized safest airlines for 2026. This is a third-party rating rather than a government certification, so travelers should consider it alongside official aviation records.

Breeze Airways Safety Record

Breeze is still a young airline, meaning its operating history is considerably shorter than that of established U.S. carriers. That makes it important to consider the available record without drawing conclusions simply from the airline's age.

One significant event involving a Breeze aircraft occurred in July 2025 at Charleston International Airport. A Breeze Airbus A220 was struck by an ANA Boeing 787 while the aircraft were on the ground. The NTSB investigated the accident and published its final report in July 2026.

The event resulted in substantial aircraft damage and two minor passenger injuries. Importantly, this was a ground collision, rather than an in-flight accident involving a Breeze flight. The NTSB's investigation attributed the event to factors involving aircraft positioning and taxi clearance.

Looking at a single incident is not enough to determine whether an airline is safe. Travelers should consider the broader regulatory and operational record.

Aircraft Used by Breeze Airways

Breeze has developed its fleet around Airbus A220 aircraft and Embraer regional jets. AirlineRatings notes that the airline's fleet transition toward the Airbus A220 has made its onboard product more consistent.

The Airbus A220 is a modern commercial aircraft designed for short- and medium-haul passenger routes. Aircraft safety, however, depends on many factors beyond the aircraft model, including maintenance, crew training, operational procedures, inspections, and regulatory oversight.

How Reliable Is Breeze Airways?

Safety and reliability are two different things. An airline can have a strong safety record while still experiencing delays, cancellations, or customer-service challenges.

Breeze focuses heavily on nonstop routes connecting smaller and underserved cities. This can be convenient for travelers who want to avoid connections through major hubs. However, its smaller network can also mean that passengers have fewer alternative flights if a disruption occurs.

Before booking, consider the importance of your travel schedule. If you need to arrive at a destination for an important event, allowing extra time can reduce the impact of an unexpected delay.

The U.S. Department of Transportation publishes Air Travel Consumer Reports covering areas such as delays, mishandled baggage, and consumer submissions, making these reports useful when evaluating airline service performance.

What Do Travelers Say About Breeze?

Passenger experiences with Breeze can vary. AirlineRatings currently lists a 4/7 passenger rating alongside its 5/7 safety rating.

Some travelers appreciate Breeze for its nonstop routes, modern aircraft, and low-cost approach. The airline also offers streaming entertainment on many flights. At the same time, passengers should remember that low-cost fares may involve additional charges for services such as baggage, seat selection, and food.

Reading recent reviews can help travelers understand the practical experience, but individual reviews should not be treated as a measurement of aviation safety.

Final Verdict: Is Breeze Airlines Safe?

So, is breeze airlines safe to fly? Based on current public information, Breeze Airways operates within the U.S. commercial aviation regulatory system, and there is no clear evidence from the sources reviewed here that it presents an unusual safety risk. Its 2025 ground collision is an important part of its relatively short history, but it should be considered in its proper context.

For travelers, the bigger consideration may be reliability and value rather than basic flight safety. Breeze can be an appealing option when its nonstop routes and fares fit your itinerary. As with any airline, check current operational information, baggage rules, and recent performance before booking.
