items.*

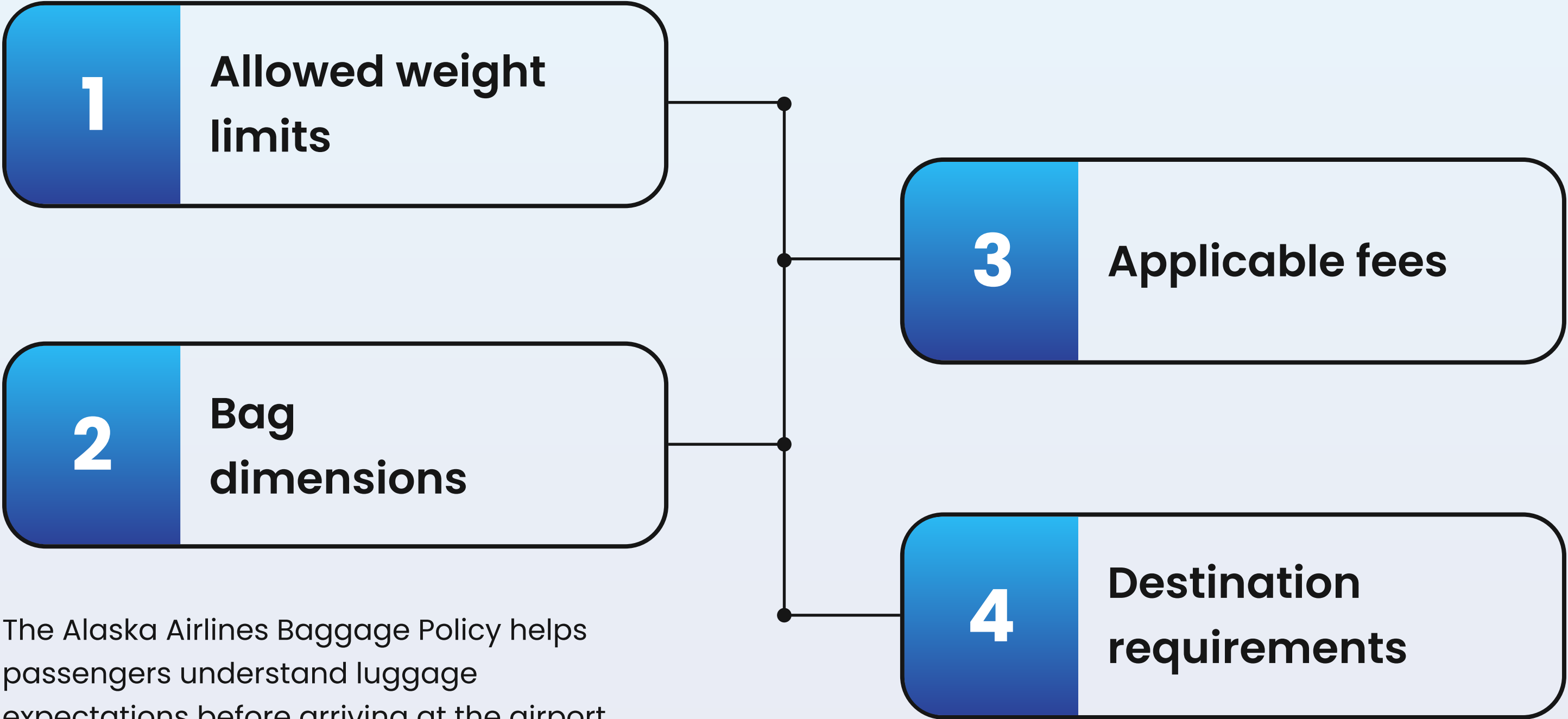
Use lightweight luggage.

Size restrictions are important because luggage must safely fit into aircraft storage areas.

Travelers should check:

- Must fit overhead bins
- Should follow airline measurements

Checked Bag Size

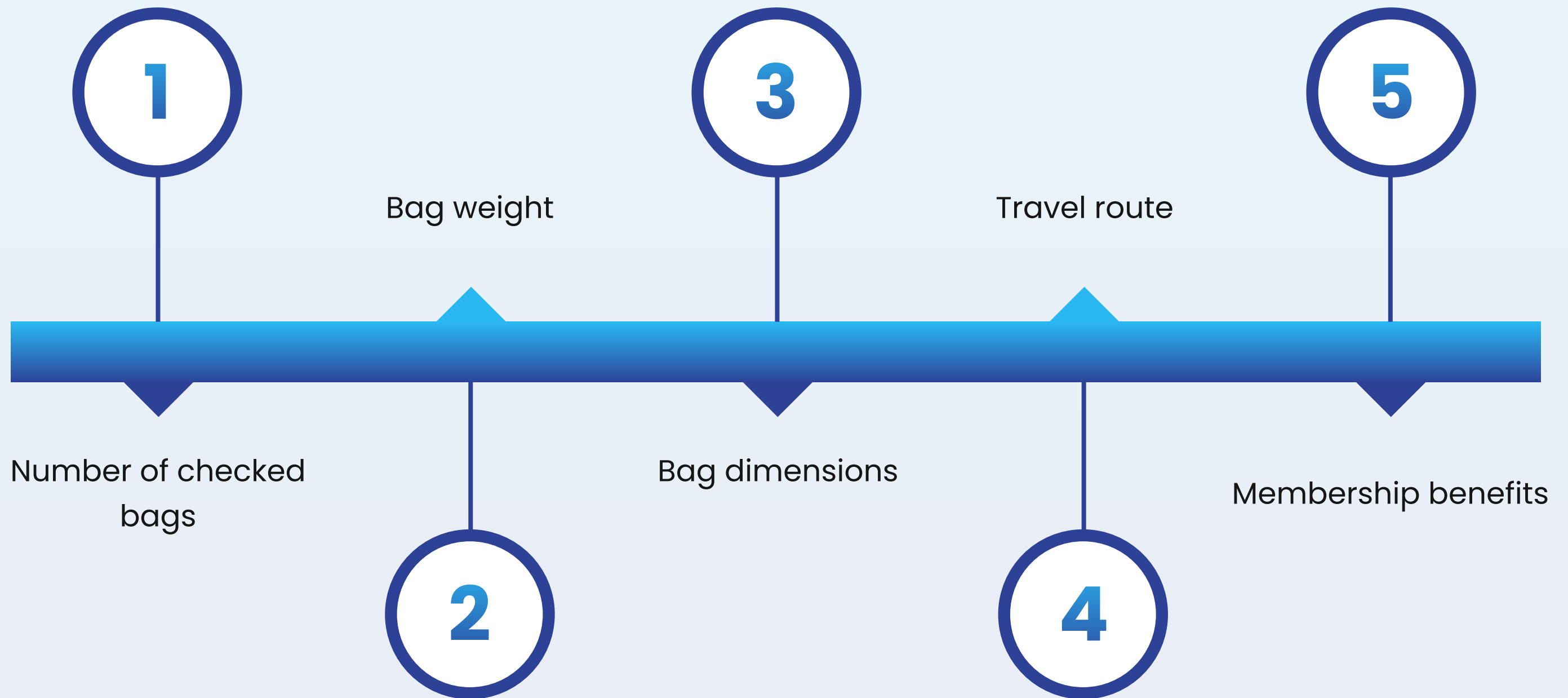
- Must meet standard airline limits
- Oversized bags may require extra charges

Measuring bags at home before departure helps prevent unexpected airport fees.
