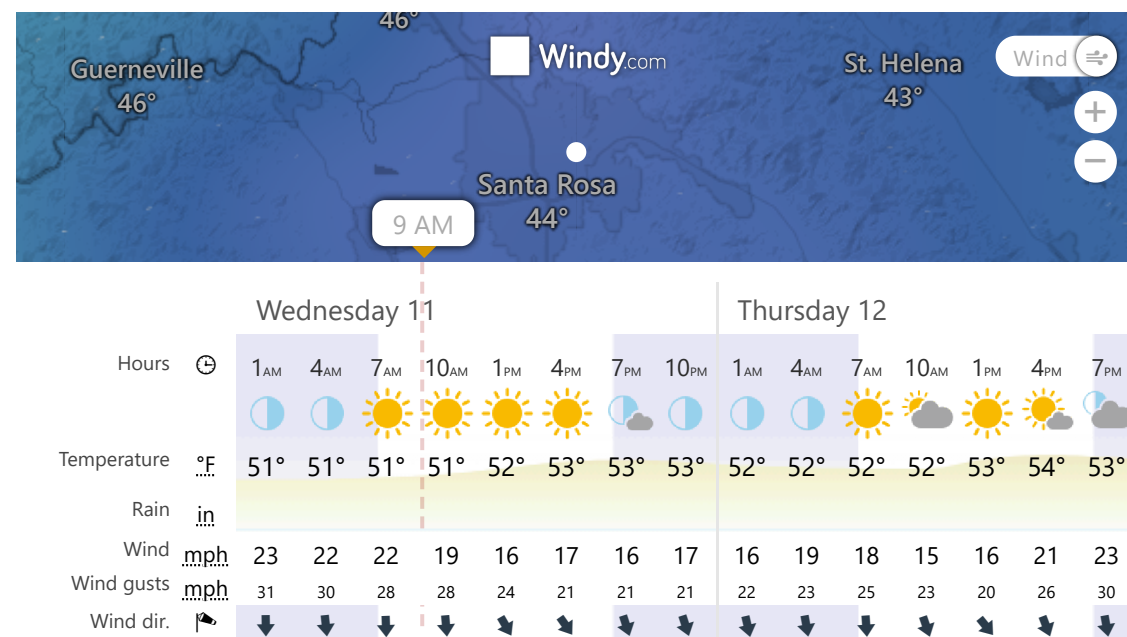

Weight-based prices appears with building and construction debris, concrete, bricks, or shingles. For e-waste, ask specifically about their recycler. There is a world of difference between a qualified downstream partner that cleans data and an operator who drops whatever at the transfer station. If you are disposing of a computer, factory-reset it, remove drives if you can, and ask whether the company provides data destruction.
