Trenchless sewer repair is often the preferred option where the damage allows for it, since it avoids tearing up a driveway, a mature landscape bed, or a stretch of hardscape that would be expensive to replace. Pipe bursting and pipe lining techniques let Murrieta Valley Plumbing restore a sewer line's full flow capacity with a fraction of the excavation a traditional dig and replace job would need. 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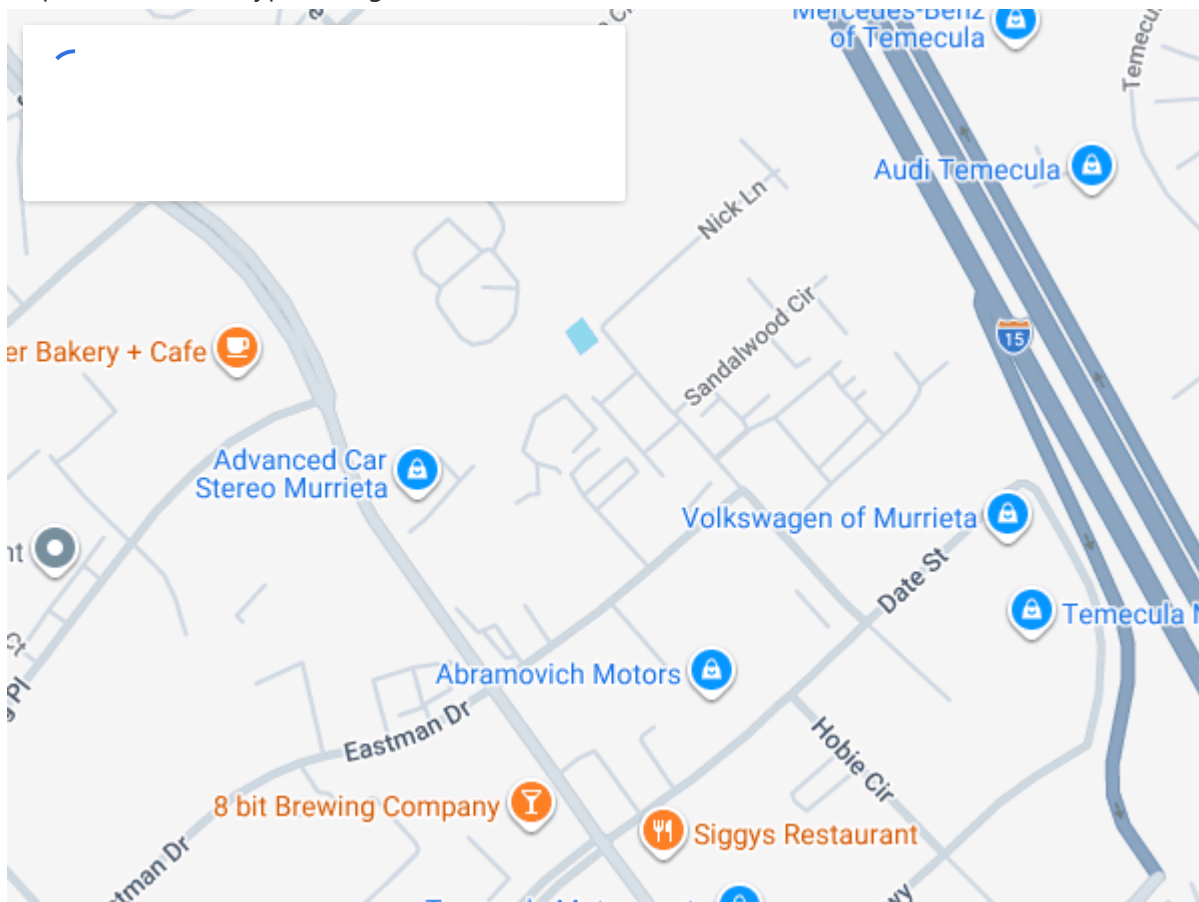
