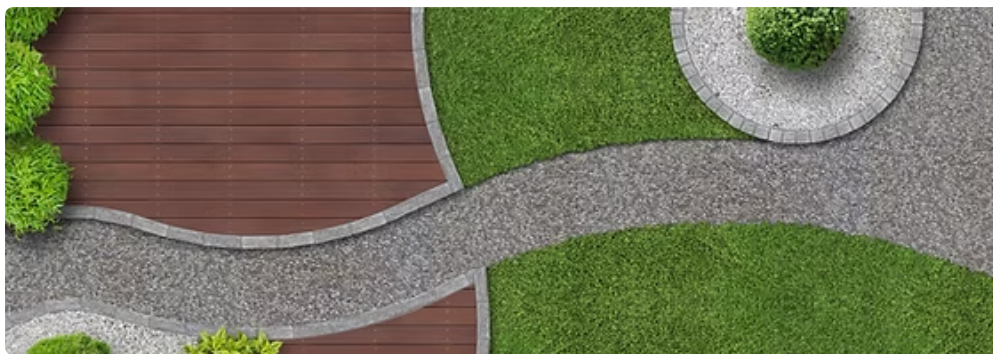
Sprinkler installation is not almost convenience
