Understanding baggage requirements before a flight can help travelers avoid unexpected charges and delays at the airport. Volaris offers different baggage options depending on the fare, route, and type of bag. Knowing the [volaris baggage rules](#) can make it easier to decide what to pack and whether to purchase additional baggage in advance.

Volaris Carry-On Baggage

Under the volaris baggage policy, carry-on allowances depend on the fare purchased. Travelers should check their reservation to determine which cabin baggage is included.

A personal item, such as a small backpack, purse, or laptop bag, may be permitted depending on the fare. Additional carry-on baggage can be available with certain fare packages or purchased separately.

Carry-on luggage must meet Volaris' applicable size and weight requirements. Bags that exceed the permitted limits may need to be checked and could result in additional charges.

Volaris Checked Baggage Allowance

Checked baggage is generally available as an optional service or may be included depending on the fare and itinerary. Travelers can add checked bags during booking or through the airline's available manage-booking options.

The permitted weight for a checked bag depends on the baggage option selected. Before traveling, passengers should verify the allowance shown on their booking because baggage conditions can vary by route and fare.

Packing within the permitted weight limit is important. An overweight bag may incur an additional fee, while baggage exceeding the maximum accepted limits may require special arrangements.

Volaris Baggage Fees

Oversized and Overweight Baggage

The [volaris baggage policy](#) also include restrictions for oversized and overweight luggage. Bags that exceed the standard dimensions or weight allowance may be subject to additional charges or transportation restrictions.

When packing large items, sports equipment, musical instruments, or other unusual baggage, passengers should review the applicable requirements before traveling. Some items may require special handling or advance arrangements.

Using a luggage scale at home is a simple way to check weight before leaving for the airport. Travelers can also measure larger bags to ensure they remain within the applicable limits.

Restricted Items

Like other airlines, Volaris restricts certain items from being carried in cabin or checked baggage. Dangerous goods, certain chemicals, explosives, and other prohibited materials may not be accepted.

Passengers should carefully review the airline's current restrictions before packing. Items such as batteries, electronic devices, liquids, sports equipment, and medical supplies may have specific transportation requirements.

If you are unsure whether an item can be carried, verify the applicable rule before going to the airport.

Tips to Avoid Extra Baggage Charges

Following a few simple steps can make baggage check-in easier:

- Check the baggage allowance included with your fare.
- Weigh your luggage before leaving home.
- Measure large bags to confirm their dimensions.
- Purchase additional baggage before arriving at the airport when possible.

- Review restrictions for special or unusual items.
- Check your booking for the latest baggage information.
