## **Practical script: What to ask before you book**

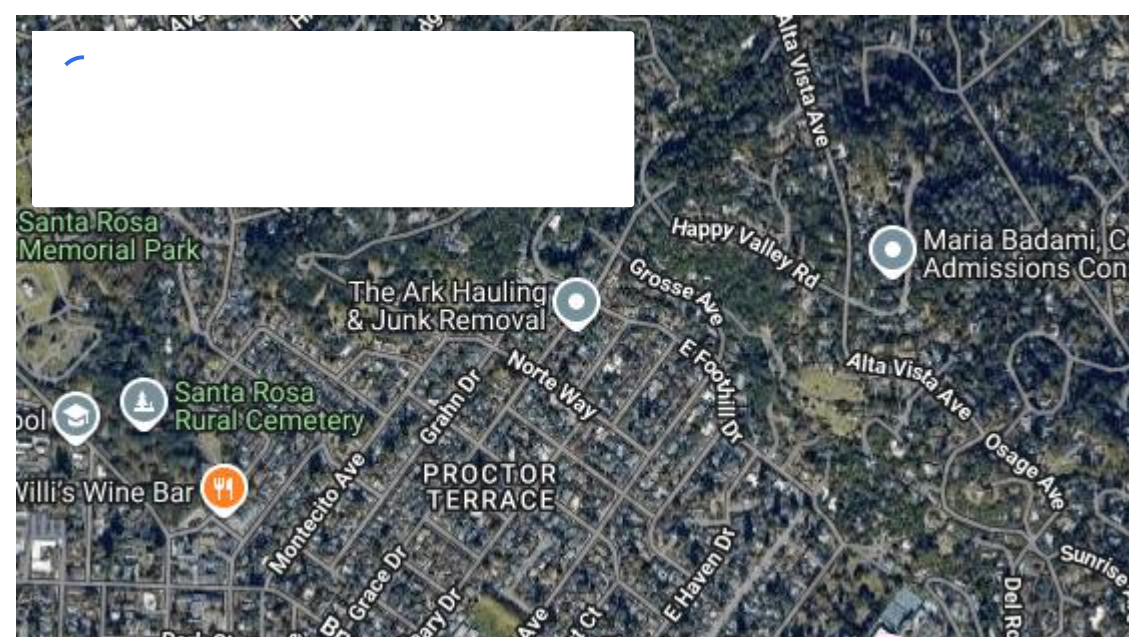
Use these five questions as a compact filter when talking with junk removal companies. Keep it conversational and direct.
